Wise Water Consumption

Did you know that the average person uses about 2,000 gallons of water each month? By considering the size of your household, you can estimate your expected monthly water usage. Conserving water not only helps the environment, but can also keep your water bill lower.

Your water bill provides valuable insights into your consumption, showing the amount of water used each month, along with a graph tracking your usage over time. This can help you spot any unexpected spikes in your water usage before they turn into surprise bills.

To ensure you're not wasting water, it's important to check for leaks regularly. A great first step is to get familiar with your water meter. It's also helpful to know the location of your master valve, so you're prepared in case of an emergency.

By staying on top of your water usage, you can keep your bill manageable and help conserve this valuable resource. Below is some helpful info on where your meter is located, how to read it, and how to check for possible leaks!

About Your Water Meter

The exact location of your water meter can vary. To find it, look for the water meter box, located on the property line. The box will have a metal, fiber glass or plastic lid.

Remove the lid and look at the meter register. The meter will have a digital display or numbers and dials. If you are not using any water, the leak indicator should be stationary. Watch it for a few minutes. If it is turning, this means there is water moving through your meter, (and may be signs of leak).
